



At 8:00 am, people started to gather in Sherman Oaks to enjoy breakfast at Marie Callender's in anticipation of a 9:30 departure for the mystery adventure. This year we had 22 cars and 38 people. The driver's meeting was called at 9:15 and everyone gathered around. As always, the meeting is about the rules of the event, driver safety, obeying traffic laws, and going over the different sections of the event, (this year there were six), introducing new and first time members, and going over the biggest mistake anyone can make on the Mystery Ride so it's not repeated this year as it seems to have been every in the year past.

I also pointed out Ron and Beverly Cressey who have been on all eight Mystery Rides. If they make it to the tenth one, without missing number nine, I'm going to give them an award.

Now, as to that biggest mistake anyone can make on the Mystery Ride, it is following the person in front of you, assuming they read their instructions. It's a big no no, yet every year someone does it and gets lost. More on that later.

This year's ride was about two hundred miles, broken down into six sections, ending at a fabulous French Restaurant. For those who have never come on a Mystery Ride, it's a ride where no one knows where we are going. You get a set of instructions at the start which gets you from point A to B, but you have to get to B to get then next set of instructions to C and so on. It's a lot of fun.

This year's ride was going to take us through the San Gabriel mountains,





across the desert, back up into the mountains, and then over to the foothills of the Angeles National Forest for lunch. The ride goes to about 4pm.

So as is typical each year after I hand out the first set of instructions, it's a Le Mans type of start with everyone running to their cars to leave first. No one has to do that of course, as if you get to point B too early you just have to wait for me to get there to give you the next set of instructions, but it has become a tradition of sorts.

Instruction one took us out to Sunland to enter the San Gabriel's. All through the mountains we drove on beautiful back roads. The weather was perfect. We came out in Palmdale and took a fantastic straight two lane highway almost to Gorman. The road was empty, and you could drive to your heart's content. You even got to enjoy some of the Poppies that were still in the fields.

At section 4 things got interesting. In this section, the instruction was to go up the hill 1.2 miles and make a left turn on Pine Canyon. That's it, pretty easy. If you didn't make the left turn and continued straight, you wound up on "The Old Road" This road has a big sign that says road is no longer maintained by the State, travel at your own risk. When I say big sign, I mean about eight feet by six feet, in an orange background with black lettering. Well, you guessed it, car number one did not read his instructions, neither did his navigator, and off they went on the "Old Road" following right behind were 15 others who assumed car number one knew where he was going and off they went. All 16 cars. Like I said, this is where it got interesting.

Meanwhile the other four cars and myself followed the instructions and wound up at the next check point about 40 miles away. We waited, and we waited, and we waited. Where are the other 16 cars? I started calling. Where they were had no cell service. After about 30 minutes I sent someone to back track, as he left a call came in. The driver told me what happened,











they figured out when they got to a gate that barred them from going further they might have made a mistake and turned around.

Oh, by the way I forgot to mention that one of the cars on the ride was an F40, that's right, a classic, rare turbo F40. Yes, you guessed it, he was one of the 16 doing the off road thing. I called the volunteer (Dave Janes) who went to find the group, and told him to come back. The lost group was on their way back to us.

After about an hour of this, the lost arrived with smiles on their faces and stories to tell. What a fantastic club this is, 16 people driving their magnificent machines on a dirt road and they were all laughing and talking about how much fun they had, and how they can't believe they did that.

The owner of the F40, who brought his Enzo last year Mr. Ron Corradini is such a gentleman. He could not stop talking about how much fun he had, and he didn't know his F40 could also be used as a dirt mover.

The gentleman who led the group, posted on

Ferrari Chat that the event was the most fun he had had with his clothes on in years. A grand time was had, and I am always impressed at the caliber of individuals who are members of this club

Section five was handed out, which got us to section six, both with no further incidents, and then lunch.

Lunch this year was at Le Chene, a beautiful French restaurant out on Sierra Highway in Santa Clarita. Owner Juan made up a most delicious four course lunch for us.

Man it was good, to say there was butter in all of it would be an understatement, but like I said it was delicious.

Well after lunch it was time to go, it was around three and people had to get home. Another fantastic and interesting "Mystery Ride" is now in the history books.

I want to thank you all for coming, and I hope to see you next year when we will run the Ninth Annual Mystery Ride.

Thanks should go out to all the sponsors and vendors who help make this show possible, and the FCA judges for a job well done.





Back in January of 2014. I proposed to the FCA SW Board a 2015 Grand Canyon Run. I had to bring it up early, as it is very difficult to get a block of rooms at a National Park, not to mention you have to pay for them up front which would put a damper in the FCA coffers. 

I want to thank Letizia Silvestri and Stefano Sbettega from Ferrari Los Angeles for arranging our factory tour.

Next stop was Monaco, where we were invited as guests of the Monte Carlo Ferrari Club to have lunch at the Automobile Club de Monaco, the private club that is involved with the Monte Carlo Rallye, Monte Carlo Historic Races and of course F1. Lucky I knew in advance a jacket and tie were required! Our hosts included Ferrari's official singer Richard Lord, who many of our members met last year when he performed for our club, and Gabriel Cavillari, VP of the Ferrari Club and the Ferrari dealer in Monaco for the past 45 years! After lunch, Richard and Gabriel took us to Gabriel's dealership where on the second floor is his private collection of twenty Ferraris including an Enzo, F40 and F50. Being their guest was an experience we won't forget. The club presented me with a Monte Carlo Ferrari Club Tie to designate me an honorary member.


The day in Monte Carlo was another example of how our club offers us the opportunity to meet amazing people who share our passion.

FERRARI F12 BERLINETTA

The 2016 Ferrari F12berlinetta is a lightning bolt of a sexy sports car that gives the driver all the thrills of a Ferrari super car. It is the top of the line for the marque because the La Ferrari is a limited edition super sports car and is not mass produced. With the DNA of the legendary 365GTB/4 Daytona which was the quintessential front engine V-12 2-seater Ferrari of the late sixties and early seventies, the F12berlinetta carries on the tradition of what Enzo Ferrari called a true Ferrari. Not until 1996 did a proper front engine V-12 2-seater coupe appear in the form of the 550 Maranello and the 575M, followed by the 599GTB in 2006 and the current F12 in 2012.

Powered by a normally aspirated V-12 displacing 6,262cc with730hp at 8250 rpm and 509 lb-ft of torque at 6000 rpm, the F12berlinetta accelerates from 0 to 62 mph in 3.1 seconds, and reaches a top speed of over 220mph. It is also equipped with Ferrari HELE system which is a start-stop system that helps the F12 achieve 18mpg, an outstanding figure providing you drive the car in a docile manner. Of course we could never achieve that as we were having too much fun driving it aggressively. All of this is connected to a 7-speed dual clutch semi-automatic transmission which is controlled by the shift paddles mounted behind the steering wheel. Brakes are Ferrari's third generation CCM3 carbon ceramic discs with ABS, SCM-E magnetorheological suspension, electronic LSD, ESP Premium stability control and F1-Trac traction control. The car's stability and traction control, suspension and other settings are controlled by the Manettino dial mounted on the steering wheel.

The styling of the F12berlinetta is pure Pininfarina with an aggressive yet familiar face and striking profile with integrated aerodynamic air-management system forming the bodywork. Extensive testing in the wind tunnel resulted in active brake cooling ducts and airflow channeled over the sides of the engine cover and exiting out the front fenders just in front of the doors. All of this and the rear diffuser help the car hunker down and stabilize it at high speed without a huge rear spoiler. Climb inside and the combination of Italian leather, Alcantara®, aluminum and carbon fiber panels greet the eyes and tickle your olfactory nerves. Our F12 was fitted with the optional carbon fiber racing seats which offered great support yet comfortable in long rides. A plethora of optional accessories like stitching and logos and leather this-and-that adorned the interior. As usual, the infotainment system is inside the instrument binnacle right in front of the driver with all important function switches on the steering wheel which also had the optional upshift LED lights as in Formula 1 racing. The gear and driving mode switches are housed in the center console and easy to access and the dual HVAC system control panel is above that.

Strap in and push the start button and the V-12 roars up to an angry growl that will let anyone around know you're in a genuine Ferrari. Select Sport or Race on the Manettino switch and you're ready for take-off. Realistically, just leave it in Sport unless you're on a race track. As you accelerate at an aggressive pace the Ferrari sound fills the cabin and soon you're in a Ferrari world an exclusive environment reserved for the few who could afford the seat. We took the F12berlinetta along our usual test loop and found it to be exhilarating and intoxicating to drive in a variety of conditions from the open highway to mountain roads and switch backs and the whole powertrain worked smoothly. The F12berlinetta is a true super sports car in the Ferrari tradition. It has carried the DNA from the 365GTB/4 Daytona but in a much comfortable, civilized and well-mannered handling chassis. We only have two gripes: the optional carbon fiber racing seats are adjustable fore and aft but not up or down. If you are not taller than 6'-6", you may not be able to adjust the steering wheel height to find a proper driving position. The window switches are very small and recessed, and our lady tester who had slightly long nails had trouble getting her finger on the switches. Otherwise the 2016 Ferrari F12berlinetta attracted attention wherever we went and was the subject of many taking photos of it alone or with people, because it is plain sexy!
