





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

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

The 2nd Annual Edwards Air Force Base Supercars and Supersonic Jets Exotic Car Show and VIP Tour was scheduled for April, but in January we were told the event needed to be postponed until mid-October. The reason given was that our car show would be combined with the Air Force 70th Anniversary Celebration including a "formal ball", moving it to October 13-14. We thought that was very cool, because it's also the 70th Anniversary of Ferrari in 2017. But we wondered why such a "formal" ball?

The Edwards Exotic Car Show was scheduled for 3 weeks after our 6th Annual Vandenberg event, which included a special VIP viewing of a night time Atlas V launch for our group. How could Edwards top a rocket launch?

The real reason the event was moved to October was finally provided in mid-September. On October 14, 1947, right there at Edwards AFB, 24-year-old Chuck Yeager was the first person ever to fly faster than the speed of sound. Our Car Show would be 70 years to the day after Chuck Yeager broke the sound barrier, and 94-year-old Brig. General Yeager was attending the celebration. Chuck Yeager was coming to our car show! The cool-factor rose to skyhigh! In addition to General Yeager, 97 year old General Bob Cardenas was there. He flew the B-29 Mothership which dropped Chuck Yeager's X-1 at 20,000 feet which then accelerated to Mach 1.06 (700 MPH) shattering the myth of a "sound barrier."























On Friday, our group of 100 people were the only civilians invited to the 70th Anniversary Supersonic Celebration and Ceremony. It was a very special honor to be invited. At the celebration, a four plane supersonic flyover passed over our heads! Then we heard speeches by Base Commander Brig. General Carl Schaefer, Brig. General Bob Cardenas (he was very funny) and Mrs. Victoria Yeager spoke for General Yeager who was sitting at the podium.

On display were over thirty amazing aircraft including a B-1, B-2, C-17, B-52, F-117, three F-16s, F-22 and a F-35! Some very high tech drones were also hovering above. After that, our group was bussed to the south end of the base where a HUGE hanger had the name Benefield Anechoic Chamber in front. Inside the huge building is the world's largest anechoic chamber with 816,000 pyramid shaped foam cones and looks like a room from outer space. They absorb RF signals so the signals don't bounce off the walls and planes can test very high tech equipment without actually flying. The 61,000 square foot room is 100% echo free and very bizarre!

That night our group, dressed in tuxedos, dark suits and formal evening gowns were the only civilian guests at the Supersonic Ball honoring Chuck Yeager. The 700 guests were in a huge hangar with numerous fighter planes surrounding the 70 round tables. The dinner, celebrating 70 years of Supersonic Flight, was very special and our group was very honored to be invited.

Saturday morning our sixty five cars lined up on the flight line with many aircraft on display. The car show wasn't open to the public, so we just displayed for the Airmen on the base and their families. Some of the car owners gave rides to Airmen and their kids, and next year we will make rides a more structured part of the event.

A large multi-dimensional event like this would not be possible without the assistance of very dedicated people at Edwards AFB. We appreciate the support from 412th FSS Director Janice Hollen and her entire team. Also, Mothers Car Care Products has donated Goody Bags for the car owners at all of our Air Force events since 2012. Jim Holloway and his staff are always enthusiastic to partner with the FCA-SW. Finally, a big thanks to our new partner Beau Boeckmann from Galpin Premier. Galpin Premier generously sponsored the Car Show Breakfast.

On the morning of September 16th, FCA-SW members met under the famed 70 foot tall "Speede" sign of the oldest existing McDonald's Restaurant in Downey, California. Our caravan of Ferraris arrived at Planes of Fame and was ushered to our special parking area in front of a Lockheed F-104 Starfighter from the 1960s. Our cars were immediately surrounded by a couple of dozen friendly museum visitors and staff who enjoyed viewing the members' Ferraris on display. Many of the museum's guests interacted with FCA members and admired the beautiful cars parked next to historic aircraft. Some members listened to a lecture by WW II veterans about their experiences and afterwards we were treated to a docent led tour of some of the museum's most interesting aircraft.

Next was lunch! Club members enjoyed a meal at Flo's Airport Café, a local airport institution serving good food in a friendly atmosphere for over fifty years. After catching up with old friends and meeting new ones, some members went back to enjoy more of what Planes of Fame had to offer and stayed until closing.









The house is reminiscent of what the owners of the old California Ranchos lived in and the interior is decorated with lots of beautiful locally made decorative tiles. Unfortunately, we had only a limited time to explore the ranch and enjoy the delicious snacks provided by Joel and Mary.

Long-time member Bill Kling helped by leading the way on part of the drive to the Mullin Museum where we enjoyed a docent led tour of Peter Mullin's collection of Citroen automobiles that encompassed the entire history of the marque. The mundane mass produced utilitarian models as well as custom bodied flamboyant examples were artistically displayed in a setting that recalls the great European auto shows of the 1920s. After the thorough and informative tour that lasted a little over an hour, we were ready for lunch.

The Waterside Restaurant proved to be a great venue for lunch offering delicious food, a dedicated parking area for our cars, and a great view of the Oxnard harbor. It was a relaxing setting to end a busy day. After lunch Bill Kling opened up his "man cave" near the Mullin Museum to interested members and shared some of the cars in his eclectic collection. 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

An overcast, gloomy Saturday morning greeted our group of 12 couples as we assembled in the parking lot at Ferrari of Westlake to begin the drive north to the wine country of Paso Robles. Although the weather forecast indicated a high chance of rain, we were fortunate to see only a slight drizzle along the route with short bursts of sunshine occasionally breaking through the cloudy skies.

Our first stop was Avila Beach and the Blue Moon Cafe, a small beachfront restaurant specializing in Panini sandwiches with a great view of the ocean. I had arranged for tables on the front patio, but the chilly, windy conditions at the beach brought us indoors where the wait staff found a way to fit our group into a few large tables. Delicious hot pressed sandwiches and poached salmon salads were served promptly and within an hour we were back on the road thanks to the over the top effort by Chef José.

A short drive up the coast from Avila Beach brought us to the Highway 46 exit and the three wineries I had chosen for our grape tour. Lake Nacimiento Road is a well maintained route that circles the wine country with lots of twisty sections, elevation changes and 23 miles of beautiful scenery. With very little traffic to obstruct our course we were able to exercise our cars in typical Ferrari-style. The tour was plotted out to end just a few miles from our host hotel the La Bellasera where upon arrival designated parking spaces separated by orange cones and police tape were provided to safely park our cars for the night, an accommodation that was greatly appreciated by our group. Once everyone arrived we were checked in to our rooms with ample time to relax before dinner.

At 7 PM we assembled for dinner in a private banquet room provided by the hotel exclusively for our group. A three course gourmet menu was prepared for us by La Bellasera's Enoteca Restaurant featuring Filet Mignon, Rack of Lamb and Alaskan Halibut with appetizers, salad, and of course wine which was served in special FCA logo stemware provided by Rich Ebner. After dinner I heard rumors of an after party in the restaurant's lounge that continued until 2 AM, but that was only a rumor!























"As a youngster, I was very interested in cars. I played with many toy cars and broke most of them playing too rough. Later, I guess around 12 maybe, I stared drawing cars and then I started building model cars.

"It was in the early '50s when I became interested in F1 and sportscar racing. I subscribed to MOTORSPORT, a British racing magazine in '54 because I couldn't find out who won the grands prix until six or seven months later from ROAD & TRACK. At least I could find out from the English magazines. They published a photo, José-Froilan Gonzalez winning Le Mans '54 in a 375 Plus and that car just blew me away. It was beautiful and brutal, Italian red, and fast. It was a Ferrari and that was it. That started my great passion for Ferrari and in '94 I met Gonzalez and he signed a photo for me. Wow!

"I bought my first sportscar in 1956 a MGA and joined the Montreal MG car club. I attended many of their events. As Ferrari was my great interest I would visit the local Ferrari dealer Luigi, who later became a good friend. His shop had 250 GTEs, 275 GTBs and Daytonas. On return trips to Montreal, I would visit him and It was like old home week.

"I met Rose in '62, and we got engaged. We drove our newly acquired '58 Corvette (4-spd, 2-4 bbl carbs) on our honeymoon." Several years later their first son arrived, so it was, "bye bye, Corvette and hello, station wagon!

"After many years of planning we moved to Los Angeles the car capital of the world in 1979. My brother in law called one day and said he'd just bought a Ferrari. A 250GTE 2+2. I didn't know that he was

interested in Ferraris! That was the push I needed to buy my own Ferrari." Murray started looking for a car and a '77 308 GTB came up, actually through Eric Sander, who Murray had been referred to by a local sportscar dealer. We joined the FOC and attended many events and met a lot of nice people."

Murray joined the FCA in '87 and attended many local events. "My brother-in-law, who was quite active in the FCA in Toronto, called me up one day and he asks 'you want to judge?' I said, 'What do you mean?' 'Well, we're going to go to the FCA Meet in Atlanta.' It was my first FCA event and I was blown away by everything. I couldn't believe the cars that were there. The Ferrari people were also friendly. Doug Friedman was President of the Atlanta Region at the time and they did a fantastic job. We had such a great time and then I went to the National for almost every year for many, many years. We got to know a lot of people and went to the National Meet for many years. It was most enjoyable to meet the same friendly people every year.

"Before we went to Europe in 1985 I contacted Pietro De Franchi, The Ferrari PR director, to arrange a factory tour. He was most gracious, such that we spent over 4 hours with him visiting almost all departments. In 1988 we went back to the factory to see Pietro, and I got a ride around Fiorano in the new F40 with the test driver. Wow what a thrill–167 mph! It was like a dream come true and we are still friends to this very day.

"When we went to Modena and Maranello in the early days it was like, you know, it was a warm feeling. You felt that you were a part of it, meeting many people at Ferrari, many of whom we are still in contact with today. We made a lot of friends over the years. We met the Schedonis in '91. Simone Schedoni arranged with the Ferrari Club Italia for people to take us to Monza for the 1993 Italian Grand Prix. Paolo Ferrario picked us up on race day, bringing a great Italian picnic lunch. Paolo is such a great friend who always arranges sightseeing and great meals for us whenever we visit.

"In 1992 I asked Ed Gilbertson if he needed someone to judge at FF40 (Forty Years of Garage Francorchamps in Brussels). I said, 'Ed, I'm available, plus I speak French fluently.' Ed said that the Europeans felt there were too many American judges. As we were already there, we went to the garage to see if we could get into the reception. We drive up and Sheri comes running out she says, 'Oh! I'm so glad you're here, one of the judges canceled.' Being an FCA judge for many years, knowing Ed, and speaking French, Rose and I got VIP documentation! It was the most spectacular Ferrari event I have ever attended. Every major significant Ferrari race winner was there as well as factory drivers Phil Hill, Oliver Gendebien, Paul Frere, Maurice Trintignant, etc. When they were giving out the trophies, Mr. Swaters invited us to sit with him in the reviewing stand.

"This was in the years when you were treated like an equal, all because we all love Ferrari. "So in '94 I think it was Tom, Marv, Cy Yedor, Marshall Lieb, Judd Goldfeder, and the FCA in the Bay area the Pacific Region asked us to form a FCA Southwest Region, which we did. I became involved with the Board because I used to go to the meetings and I'd always like to take notes because it was the only way I will remember what happened! I was taking notes for many years and I unofficially became the Secretary over the years.

"When Bill's (Inglis) Presidency term was up in '03 he, Brockmiller, and a few other guys said 'You're it!' I said ok, I mean at first I didn't want to do it because I was never one to be the leader, but I took it on and it was fun. I ran the meetings, got involved with a few things and we had good time. We had a lot of events. We went on at least two or three drives to Sequoia. One year it was snowing and a TR almost went into the ditch. Another year there was an old gal passing everybody over the yellow line and around the curves." The club had to have a sit-down and speak with her at dinner that evening. "We went to Palm Springs. Every event we went to, we knew a lot of people. It was really warm and friendly and we were driving our cars. We were having a good time and the traffic wasn't as bad then.

"Over the years we have owned several Ferraris including a 1962 400 SA Superamerica. I presently own a 1985 308 GTB QV which I bought in 1994. It's fun to drive but I wanted something faster with better handling. I got the itch for a 360 in 2008 and bought an '02 360 Modena 6-speed." In true enthusiast fashion, Murray has also built a fantastic memorabilia and die-cast collection.

"My association with the FCA and Ferrari has brought us much enjoyment and many friends."



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

"It was absolutely one of the most amazing cars I've ever owned in my life. I raced that car, I wrecked that car, I drove the living hell out of that car!"

250 SWB, 2819 GT, finished 2nd in the 1961 Tour de France, and was later sold by driver Olivier Gendebien to Count Giovanni Volpi, who was in hot water with Enzo Ferrari for sponsoring the exiled ATS Racing Team. The chassis was modified by ATS founder Bizzarrini and re-bodied by Drogo to compete against the 250 GTO's that Volpi could not acquire.

Matthew Ettinger is the renown former owner of the infamous Ferrari #2819 GT which became known as the Breadvan. His story epitomizes Southern California, iconic cars, and larger than life characters. Bitten by the car bug early in life, Matthew has sought and enjoyed speed. "From the time I had a 3-wheel trike, I wanted to go fast.

"On rainy days I would go to school in a bubble gum police car with the rotating light because my mother was with the Sheriff's Department. Everybody looked when you pulled up in the police car. It did have its advantages because nobody wanted to pants me. You know back in the '50s they used to run up to you and pull your pants down!"

"I grew up in an area that was populated mostly by dairies and the Dutchman Kenny Howard, and everyone had new, beautiful cars. The '50s Chevys, and up and to my graduation year '55, that beautiful, beautiful Chevy Nomad.

I coveted a '48 Plymouth convertible. Oh, I loved that car, and because I had mentioned that so much, my father bought me













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

a 4-door '48 Plymouth after I graduated." Unfortunately that particular car didn't quite satiate Matthew's desire, "So I immediately rammed it into a big rig and that took care of that!" Matthew's father replaced it with a '48 Plymouth coupe, which he loved. "There have been many moments where I've yearned for that car. It powered me through Southern California from one end to the other. It was a great car. After that I got a '55 Chevy that I hot-rodded and in between the Plymouth and the Chevy there were 15 billion other cars that I had for 15 or 20 minutes to drive, race, and crash."

It was inevitable, however, that Matthew's attention would soon turn to Ferrari. "Looking at pictures, reading about Enzo, the races, I suddenly had this insatiable desire to have a Ferrari. Back then there was no ego about it, no financial plateau related to owning the car. Ferrari was never connected to that kind of euphoria. It was emotional." In time, Matthew's automotive endeavors would be transformed by this desire.





And it was. Matthew received a phone call from Larry Watson, of candy apple red hot rod fame. 'Matthew, Do you still want a Ferrari? You better get down here right away.' "So I go down to his shop and here is a beautiful Ferrari Lusso. I got so emotional. My heart swelled looking at this gorgeous car, it's beauty, it's lines, it's sculpture. Oh my, it's gorgeous." It was also crashed.

As luck would have it, the wrecked car belonged to a wealthy gentleman who had grown weary bailing his oft-errant grandson out of trouble. "Well, I guess it finally reached the straw-breaking stage and the grandfather told him that's it, you're not getting back in that car, get on a plane, and come home." Matthew shrewdly offered the kid a check for \$4,500. "I give him the check and he says, 'I'm gonna go to the local Ferrari dealer.'" Unbeknownst to the grandson, Matthew was friends with that dealer: Otto Zipper. "I call Otto. 'Look, if you're ever in your life going to do me a favor, now is the time. A guy's gonna come over and ask you to buy his car with the wrecked door and kind of a dent in the fender. I gave him a check for 4,500 bucks, would you offer him 4,000 dollars?' Understand this was virtually a brand new car, Otto could have made a helluva lot of money fixing it. Otto replied, 'Boy, you will owe me for the rest of your life.'"

"I gathered this pattern of getting what I really wanted, enjoying it to the max, and then selling it. It gave me the financial wherewithal to go to the next step and then I bought a 250 LM." Matthew's friend Stephen Mitchell, who owned the fabulous 250 GTO now owned by Ralph Lauren, soon stumbled upon a cast aside Dino racecar that Matthew purchased and later sold to Ed Niles. "This went on and on until the Breadvan."

"I'd been run over by an Olds Rocket 98 putting up a sign in front of my nightclub. I'm in a wheel-chair and finally after 4 months in traction Peggy's wheeling me into this hotel in Santa Monica, and in the lobby sits the Breadvan. I go nuts. I just love strange looking things. As Clark had bought the car from Gary Wales. He was over 6 feet tall, how the hell he fit in that car I have no idea. I go crazy. 'Asa, you wanna sell that car? Without the slightest pause he says, 'Yes!' I said,

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

The car had found its way to Los Angeles via Gary Wales, who had acquired the car in Detroit. "The Breadvan is the one car in my history that I regret selling more than anything. There have been things that I've garnered, but the Breadvan really stands out in my mind. That's the emotional part of owning a Ferrari."

Yet it was merely a facet of a passion Matthew exuded in his work arranging club dinners with the likes of Dan Gurney, Phil Hill, the Rodriguez brothers, and in trips to the factory, meeting Enzo Ferrari. "I actually met him twice and the second time with my second wife who was absolutely one of the most beautiful women in the world. It was a fact.

"We walk into the factory in Maranello and are greeted by the sales manager and he sees Diane. Then the next person comes into the showroom, sees Diane, and then somebody told everybody and suddenly the showroom is filled with all these suited guys.

"We're invited to the restaurant down the road from the factory for lunch. We're sitting at the table and we hear a commotion at the front, and in walks Enzo Ferrari. He walks over to the table. The guy sitting in front of Diane immediately gets up and gives up his chair, and Enzo sits down in front of Diane. There was a moment when she was using her fork in her salad and she let out this audible scream and everybody says what's wrong?! There was a little white worm in her salad. I'm telling you with God as my witness, Enzo reaches over, picks up the worm at the edge of the plate and says, 'Singora, Proteina!' and puts it in his mouth and eats it.

"It was totally a different time. The relationships with the people there, the cars, the whole atmosphere, it was a different playing field. Never once did you ever get a feeling that a Ferrari was a jewelry piece. It was never a sculpture that you were going to show off. It was a sculpture, but it was a thing of adventure and we were all very enthusiastic about having that particular marque of car. It was a whole different feeling back then, driving the hell out of those cars. Stephen and I would meet early in the morning after I'd close down the club. He would come in the GTO and we would take off for Palm Springs or Big Bear or some wild place to go for breakfast. That was like almost every other week. My god it was great. Those were the days."

Matthew, however, has not lost any of his passion and is still living the Ferrari dream at full throttle to this day. Among several cars in his stable, his current prancing horse is a 2000 550 Maranello, complete with the Fiorano handling package and beautiful red stitching in the interior. He also maintains one of the most impressive memorabilia collections anywhere, presented in a fashion any Ferrarista would not soon forget.

"Every time I get out of my car, as I have all my Ferrari life, I pull up, shut the engine off, open the door, get out of the car, walk maybe 10, 15 feet, and turn around and look at the car. If I have to make 10 stops that day, I will do that 10 times, because I look back at that car and I say, how blessed am I to be so fortunate, to own a Ferrari and it's so gorgeous."
