





Ferrari windshield wipers are rarely used, but on this day they did turn out to be rather handy. The event was advertised as the first ever Green Ferrari driving event. In keeping with this theme our excursion resembled a wet season drive arranged by the Ferrari Club of Ireland. We had mist, cool weather and some light rain. 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In addition to the much needed mist and rain, several other green features were included as part of this FCA Celebration of Earth Day. Each participant received a Compact Fluorescent Light bulb (CFL) that uses about 1/4 of the power of an incandescent bulb. Also, a small portion of each participants entry fee was donated to the CarbonFund (www.carbonfund.org), an organization that deals in carbon offsets. In this way the CO2 generated by 30 Ferraris motoring through the countryside was offset by contributions to support renewable energy sources (wind, solar) and biomass digestion (don't ask). 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
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REGULAR SERVICE INTERVALS

Maintaining Your Ferrari

So you've just purchased a new Enzo, or a nice used 355 and you've been told that the annual maintenance (or every 5000 miles) is \$2,000, and includes engine and transmission oil, cooling system, clutch and brake fluid flush and replace, and appropriate filters. Since you have three Ferraris you figure that you'll only drive the car 1000 miles a year, so you can just defer that service for a few years. Wrong—that could be a mistake.

I discussed the issue of low mileage Ferraris and maintenance with Alan Woodard and John Amette of Orange County Ferrari, Graziano Negroni and Jerry Hicks of Beverly Hills Ferrari, Chuck Houck of the Auto Gallery, and independent Carl Steuer of Blackhorse Motors, and there is general consensus that there are excellent reasons for regular service intervals, with differing opinions based on individual experience.

It is a fact that disuse is not good for a car, as impressive as a low teen mileage number may seem on the counter at auction. Ferraris are meant to be driven, and if neglected there are a variety of issues which arise, in the worst case a used car syndrome Houck called "lot rot." Gas goes bad, oil seals leak, shocks freeze up, tires deteriorate from ozone, and you aren't having as much fun as you should.

There are several issues: first normal usage causes hot air to exit, and colder air to enter the open cavities of the engine and transmission, which adds moisture to the internals. Moisture combines with metals to cause corrosion, especially of the car isn't fully warmed up during use.

The hydraulic fluid in the clutch and braking systems is hydrophilic, that is it attracts and holds water. This water lowers the boiling point of the fluid, and causes corrosion. Thus, brake (and clutch) fluid should be renewed at least every 18 to 24 months, or just before a track event, where brakes will be used hard.

The coolant in the radiator is a mixture of antifreeze and water. If it is tap water it contains minerals which can precipitate corrosion, after the anti freeze has lost its anti-corrosion components due to age. Alan suggested that for a low usage collector car, a mix of distilled water and anti freeze could be left in place for two to four years without worry. Normally, every 12 to 24 months is adequate.


The last point is the benefits of having an experienced mechanic check your Ferrari over top to bottom regularly for other issues which, if uncorrected, could cause expensive problems down the road.

It is important to find a dealer or shop that you trust. Never take your Ferrari to a SleeZ Lube or a Gyppi Lube – there was a sad case of one of those outfits mistaking the transaxle drain plug on a Dino 246 for the engine drain, draining the transaxle, then over filling the engine – resulting in a failed trans.

Your Ferrari can reward you with high performance and satisfying reliability, but only if it is treated to the expert care and fresh fluids it needs to cool and lubricate it properly.

The best advice I can offer is to drive that Prancing Horse often and hard (after it's fully warmed up) – and the Ferrari Club offers great opportunities to do that in the company of fellow enthusiasts. **SF**

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
