


On Saturday, September 3rd, more than 20 FCA Ferraris were on display at the



Mad Dash to Sequoias Reaches Successful Conclusion


BAILOUT PLAN NOT REQUIRED

My Friends, in late May

delegates from both sides of the FCA-FOC aisle set off on a challenging driving tour from Valencia, CA to the Sequoias. In this joint effort, Robert De Pietro was the organizational leader for the FOC, and I played a similar role for the FCA. Under normal circumstances, the drive from Valencia to the Sequoias would require something like 4-5 hours. As organizers of this event, however, we turned the trip into a two and a half day adventure. Secret back roads were used to give participants an idea of what road travel might have been like in the early part of the 20th Century. One of the roads was originally a stagecoach route, and on this road we passed the scene of the last stage robbery in Kern County (still unsolved). The 2008 Mad Dash was modeled after a similar event created by Walt and Carolyn Ward in the 1980's, and they remain an important inspiration for those who enjoy drives like this. In 2008, some new tweaks were introduced just to keep things interesting. Continued on page 13



During our two plus days together, driving activities were augmented with time for relaxing and conversation, hopefully making the event enjoyable for passengers as well as drivers. The lodge was originally built to serve loggers, and still today it is known for offering a 40 oz. steak that will satisfy the heartiest appetite. Several Rangers were on hand and they guided us to a reserved parking area where we are warned to remove any food from the cars so the local bears would not be tempted to tear off the doors and mar our lovely Schedoni upholstery. Our sincere thanks to the Rangers for a much appreciated introduction to the Park.

Finally we made our way to the Wuksachi Lodge in Sequoia National Park where the receptionist again warned about the bears. After checking into our comfortable rooms it was cocktail time. With no bears in sight, the short trek to the Main Lodge was negotiated safely and members of our group gathered around the Bar and the attractive Hors D'oeuvre table. This all went well and everyone was in a

We can only assume that he had a very enjoyable morning even though there was no evidence of trout in his bag. After the tour was over Hank sent us a photo of some trout he had seen on another trip to the high country.



Ever since I started attending

"Monterey" in 1975 as the historic races were in their formative years, it has been a dream of mine to have the SWB I've owned for over 30 years to be displayed on the rarified lawn at Pebble Beach. My dream finally became reality when our SWB was graciously accepted by the concours selection committee this year.

The Pebble Beach experience began early Thursday morning with the 11th annual Pebble Beach Tour d'Elegance presented by Rolex. Assembled this foggy morning at the of equestrian grounds, were the sights and sounds of over one hundred years of automotive history. Cars which finish the Tour earn a tie-breaking nod in Sunday's concours should there be two equally judged cars in a class.

As this was our first time as a participant at Pebble, my wife Tambi and I wanted to absorb as much atmosphere as the senses would allow of what was sure to be memorable weekend. After viewing the impressive line up of machinery on Portola Road and much mutual congratulatory greetings with friends, the Tour started with Sir Stirling Moss leading the way.

Our route followed portions of the fabled 17-Mile Drive, then headed towards Highway 1 where the Tour went south to Big Sur and returned back to Carmel-by-the-Sea. It was quite fun seeing the wide variety of classics coming at us along the coast, some with a full car load of people enjoying their drive in such beautiful landscape.

The people-lined streets became ever more crowded as the Tour entered Carmel, as if we were in the final stage of the Tour de France. All of the cars parked on Ocean Boulevard, where people swarmed throughout the street to get a closer look. It was intimidating to leave our car among the packed street to go to the participant's catered lunch, but most people seemed to respect the cars.

After lunch, the Tour returned to the polo fields for a post event champagne celebration, where the Tour ribbons were awarded which displayed completion of the event.

Friday and Saturday were open days to allow time to freshen up the cars after the Tour, with evenings full of sponsored parties including a Lexus fashion show, Land Rover party at the Tennis Center, a AFAS Exhibition party and a Saturday evening Gala by Chrysler. This big band era themed party had an art deco ambiance which included ice sculptures and new and vintage Challengers. Those Dodge boys know how to throw a party.

The 2008 Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance featured the marques of Lancia and Lamborghini and celebrated the centennial of General Motors with dramatic displays of Motorama concepts including a Futureliner bus, Cadillac V-16s, GM-powered sports cars and GM Woodies. Special classes also focused on the fiftieth anniversary of the Ferrari Spyder California and cars with engines displacing 20 liters or more.

Sunday morning started very early with the placement of the cars in their designated categories. We followed the 312 P and 312 PB who were also in our Ferrari Competition class through the Lodge property to the lawn. The peaceful misty morning air was shattered by the bark of our 12 cylinder engines. That was awesome.

One last turn and before us was the hallowed 18th green of Pebble Beach. Every entrant was given a Meguiar's bag of car care products and a huge Grundy sponsored entrant bag containing Mercedes-Benz leather goods, display signage and event commemorative items to remember this special day.

The cars exhibited on the 18th fairway at the Pebble Beach Lodge are always spectacular in their presentation and are the rarest of the breed. Prototype, one of one or custom coachwork tends to be a regular part of each car's resume, along with a rich provenance of previous owners and worldly accomplishments.

In the research of our car, we learned that 2033 GT Competizione's first race was at the 1960 Coppa Inter-Europa at Monza, driven by the original owner and regular Ferrari patron Vladimiro Galluzzi. Photos taken by journalist Jerry McDermott recorded the start and race which supported the car's physical evidence, and it was this race's livery to which 2033 GT was restored. To honor 2033's competition history, we adorned her with her Monza racing

numbers 54 for the show. Knowing that we didn't outfit the car as it was delivered with bumpers, it remained to be seen how the judges would interpret our SWB's correctness.

Many times owners of the large classic cars dress in period to coordinate with their vintage car. To have some fun, we wore ensembles of early the 1960's with Tambi wearing a Jackie O. inspired suit with a pill box hat and me wearing a skinny suit of a simpler era.

The expert judges scrutinized each car in our class and soon they were ready to examine our SWB. I presented our book of 2033 GT's history and then each member of the judging team began to study their area of the car: interior, chassis and body and tool kit. The most fun and anticipated part of the judging was starting the engine and hear the throaty idle in the quiet hush of the overcast morning.


Through the day we had the opportunity to meet a lot of great people who were enthusiastic about seeing our car and share car stories, including Piero Ferrari and Jean Todt.






